Certified Healthy Oklahoma is a statewide recognition program that offers a free assessment tool allowing businesses, campuses, communities, congregations, early childhood programs, restaurants, and schools to gauge where they stand on supporting health with an annual certification award showcasing their commitment to actively promoting wellness.

Eligible Applicants

- ◆ A community is defined as “An incorporated city, town, or municipality in Oklahoma that has a governing body that allows it to make decisions and set ordinances”
- ◆ Categories: ● Sub-Rural (<500) ● Rural (501- 4,300) ● Small (4,300 – 13,399) ● Medium (14,000 – 29,999) ● Large (30,000 – 79,999) ● Metro: (80,000+)

Application Sections

- ◆ Tobacco and Alcohol
- ◆ Nutrition and Physical Activity
- ◆ Community Resources
- ◆ Education/Awareness

Scoring

Communities are scored based on the population size of the community and points received per section. In addition to meeting the point requirement, to obtain BASIC certification, the municipality must have adopted and implemented an ordinance that prohibits smoking indoors and outdoors on city owned/operated properties. EXCELLENCE has five prerequisites which include an adopted and implemented municipal ordinance that prohibits the use of tobacco and vapor products on all indoor and outdoor city-owned/operated properties.
